- 5. Forgiving someone & also accepting your forgiveness.


Sierra Vista Presbyterian Church has been doing an eight week God and Country series for Scouts.

### PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE

The search for the next installed pastor is a deliberate process that may seem excessively long and tedious. We are actively searching for the person God is calling for our next pastor. We have received several Personal Discernment Profiles (PDPs) from the denominational Church Leadership Connection (CLC) system for consideration. So far, all received PDPs have been reviewed and noted as one of the following categories:

- Interested/ Invite to Apply, or
- No interest/ No Longer Interested

For those noted as "Invite to Apply", the CLC sends out a message to the potential candidate to inform them of a possible interest and inquires of the candidate's interest in being considered.

The Pastor Nominating Committee has received about 15 candidate profiles from the CLC. After review of the information, the committee determined there was no further interest in some of the candidates. Several were deemed to be of potential interest to the committee and the CLC was notified. Out of those, five have responded as not interested or have withdrawn from consideration.

We have requested additional matches from the system and still assessing interest in others.

Out of respect for candidates, their families, and the churches they may presently serve, we are intentionally confidential about what we can share publicly.

We trust that the Holy Spirit is guiding this process and ask that you continue to pray with us continually. As a reminder, the opening is publically posted and we welcome you to send the opportunity to anyone you may know that might have an interest in living in Arizona and serving at Sierra Vista. We are grateful for the opportunity to serve Sierra Vista Presbyterian Church and are excited about who God is preparing to come as our next pastor.

## CLERK'S REPORT

The March Session Meeting was to handle routine business. The Consent Agenda included the recording of the ordination of Sharon Brainard on March 2 and the recording of communion being served on the same day. The Consent Agenda was unanimously passed.

Two new members were noted. John and Gwenda Fletcher were accepted as new members at a Special Session Meeting held on March 9.

Remaining business for the Session included the Pastor's Report, correspondence from the clerk, and receipt and approval of the February financial report. The Trustees presented and were granted approval for several building use requests. Other Trustee reported activities included the repair of the chain link fence at the southeast corner of the grassy area, the reconfiguration of the former library area, the completion of the backflow inspection, and the replacement of all exterior faucets with more secure items.

#### Committee reports included:

Care Portal – Care Portal cases continue to come in and we support and fulfill needs as we can. Over 1000 children in Yuma County have been served since the inception of the Care Portal in 2018.

Christian Education – God and Country Study for the High School age group is underway. The required meeting with Pastor Dan is scheduled for April 6 and the recognition of the God and Country Awards will be done during the Worship Service on April 13. Plans for Easter celebrations were discussed. These plans include an Easter Egg Hunt on April 20 and a scavenger hunt for sixth grade and up youth during the Fellowship Hour.

Mission Activities – The Baked Potato Bash was held in Sunday, March 23 during Fellowship Hour. The event raised \$ 1,099 which will be sent to the Jesus Pan De Vida Church in San Luis Rio Colorado.

Worship – Plans for the upcoming services for Palm Sunday – April 13, Maundy Thursday – April 17, and Easter Sunday on April 27 were noted.

The Session asks for prayers for the Pastor Nominating process and the continuing work of the Session.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

# For the Month of February 2025 ANALYSIS OF FEBRUARY REPORTS

Profit and Loss Report

#### **INCOME**

Total income received for February was \$ 16,400.88. This includes all income for the month and consists of donations in the offering plate, and on-line donations through Vanco Services (\$3,818.33). If there are any donations to Special Funds (such as Care Portal and Crossroads Mission), they are included in income amounts but are transferred to the Restricted Account as per the designation. Contributions to Special Funds totaled \$ 570.10 including donations to CarePortal, Souper Bowl, and the Tour de Fields bike ride.

#### **EXPENSES**

Total expenses for February totaled \$22,811.56 including \$520.10 Designated Monies Expenses (to the Crossroads Mission for funds from the Souper Bowl and the Tour de Fields events. There were no extraordinary expenses in February but the Annual Domain Reservation fee for the web site in the amount of \$1,200.00 came due in February.

#### **Bank Accounts**

#### Current balances at the end of February were:

Restricted Account (Designated Funds) \$ 20,799.36 Wells Fargo checking account \$ 71.90

#### **SUMMARY**

Through 2025, we have spent \$ 14,717.68 more than we have brought in. We are fortunate that we have the Investment Account. As of March 18, 2025 we have a bank balance of uncommitted funds of <\$ 2,257.11>. This balance recognizes the April 1 payment for the second quarter of the Liability Insurance (\$ 2,744.75) and the March Board of Pensions payment which was due on March 25 but it does not include costs for the March 31 payroll. Our Treasurer will continue to monitor the bank account and will tap the Investment if necessary.

As our Winter family returns home, we need to thank them for their support and wish them a safe journey until they return to Yuma.



#### **OVERALL PROGRAM**

All portions of the Sierra Vista Scout Program will be taking a break starting March 27 and will resume meeting on April 8.

#### **GIRL SCOUTS**

The Girl Scouts have completed selling the delicious Girl Scout cookies. Our Troop 8054 girls sold over 20,000 boxes. Funds raised from cookie sales go toward the support of our Troop 8054 program.

#### **CUB SCOUTS**

The Cub Scout Pack is continuing with achieving the various rank requirements. A Pack Meeting where achievements were recognized was held on March 26th. We are planning on a family camping adventure the weekend of April 25-27. This camp will be at the Scouting America Balboa Park Campground in San Diego. More information will be forthcoming. The deadline for registrations is April 14. Fees for the camp are \$ 8.00 per camper, \$10.00 per person for the optional meal plan, and \$ 5.00 for range fees for youth participating in archery and bb gun shooting.

#### **BOY SCOUT TROOP**

The Troop 8054 boys continue to work on merit badges and rank advancements. Campouts and Courts of Honor are scheduled during April. On March 19, an Eagle Court of Honor was held for Daniel Troxel and Cody Hill's Eagle Court of Honor is scheduled for April 3.
