They seem to be easier when you are younger. I remember when Shelley and I lived in Johnson City, TN on our way home late one night we hit black ice and slid across the freeway, through a median, up the other side of the freeway, back to the median and stopped. Having done a 360 on the ice we were scared but gave thanks to God that there were no other cars on the road. I will always remember driving that freeway later and realizing, there was only one place we could have gone across the median and back on without hitting something and that is where we stopped. and when you pass through the rivers,

These familiar words inspired several great hymns of faith including the NAVY HYMN "ETERNAL FATHER STRONG TO SAVE" and one of my favorite hymns, "HOW FIRM A FOUNDATION."

Verse three is a paraphrase of Isaiah 43:2:

"When through the deep waters I call thee to go, the rivers of sorrow shall not overflow; for I will be near thee, thy troubles to bless, and sanctify to thee thy deepest distress.

There will always be adventures in life. Storms will come and go, but one thing is certain. God who created us, who formed us, has called us and redeemed us. As the Heidelberg Catechism reminds us, "in life and in death we belong to God." Know this and be assured, wewill pass THROUGH the waters that assail us for we stand on the Firm Foundation of God's love given to us in Jesus Christ our Lord.

For the coming year, we know that we will see increased cost in utilities, pest control, liability insurance, and worker's compensation. These are the items that we know about. Unfortunately, we have no control over these increases so all we can do is suggest that if you can give more, then please do so.
