CLERK'S REPORT

The April Session Meeting was to handle routine business. The Consent Agenda included the approval of minutes from previous meetings and the service of communion on April 6. The Consent Agenda was unanimously passed.

One new member was added in April. The Session welcomed new member Sharon Roberts on April 6. Sharon comes to us by Reaffirmation of Faith.

Remaining business for the Session included the Pastor's Report, correspondence from the clerk, and receipt and approval of the March financial report.

Committee reports included:

Care Portal – Care Portal cases continue to come in and we support and fulfill needs as we can. Over 1000 children in Yuma County have been served since the inception of the Care Portal in 2018.

Christian Education – God and Country Study for the High School age group was completed with the recognition of the graduates on Sunday, April 13. Easter celebrations including an Easter Egg Hunt and a scavenger hunt for sixth grade and up youth during the Fellowship Hour were held on Easter Sunday, April 20.

Mission Activities – We heard a presentation from Esteban Escobar, Pastor of the Mission Partnership Cocopah Assembly of God congregation on Sunday, April 27.

Worship – It was a blessed Easter season. The Easter lilies which adorned the sanctuary were beautiful and reflected the glory of Christ. On Monday, April 21, all lilies that were not claimed were donated to residents of Casa Sierra Vista apartments, a facility for low income and elderly residents.

The Session asks for prayers for the Pastor Nominating process and the continuing work of the Session.

TREASURER'S REPORT

For the Month of March 2025 ANALYSIS OF MARCH REPORTS

Profit and Loss Report

INCOME

Total income received for March was \$ 19,526.76. This includes all income for the month and consists of donations in the offering plate, and on-line donations through Vanco Services (\$3,847.48). Income for March compared to February appears to be an increase, however the income includes the Baked Potato Bash and a designated \$ 1,000 for Jesus Pan de Vida. ALL donations to Special Funds (such as Care Portal, Jesus Pan de Vida, and Baked Potato Bash) are included in income amounts but are transferred to the Restricted Accounts. Total donations to Special Funds totaled \$ 1,249.00 including donations to CarePortal and Jesus Pan de Vida/ Baked Potato Bash. Not included in this Special Funds amount was a \$ 1,000.00 donation that was designated to go the Jesus Pan de Vida.

EXPENSES

Total expenses for March totaled \$24,276.65.56 including \$ 2,099.00 Designated Monies Expenses to Jesus Pan de Vida (SAM/MAS). There were no extraordinary expenses in March.

Current balances at the end of February were:

Restricted accounts displayed by title of the sub-account \$20,799.52 Wells Fargo checking account \$11,038.11

SUMMARY

Through 2025, we have spent \$ 19,467.57 more than we have brought in. We are fortunate that we had the Investment Account. As of April 15, 2025 we have a bank balance of uncommitted funds of \$ 6,072.49. This balance does not include payroll for April 30, 2025, required PCUSA benefits, or the pending payment for the fire alarm replacement (will be discussed in Trustees Report). The Treasurer will continue to monitor the account balances and will tap the investments if absolutely necessary.



OVERALL PROGRAM

We are winding down another successful year. The final day of scouts for this activity year is May 21. We have reserved the giant water slide and are planning for a fun afternoon/ evening. Dinner that evening will be a potluck from families and the program will provide lemonade, plates, napkins, and utensils, and hotdogs and buns along with condiments. Each family is requested to bring a dish to share. Suggestions include cheeses and any other popular fixings, desserts, chips, salads, and sides.

The annual family camp in the Laguna Mountains will not be held this summer. We were unable to reserve space at the Horse Heaven Campground where we have traditionally held the event.

GIRL SCOUTS

The final Awards and Recognition ceremony for the Girl Scouts will be held on Wednesday, May 15. Our Sierra Vista Girl Scout Troop sold over 15,000 boxes of the Girl Scout cookies. Although cookie season has wrapped up, we might be able to locate cookies if there is a deep desire.

CUB SCOUTS

The final Pack Meeting with Awards and Recognitions will be held TUESDAY, May 13. Our Wolf Bear Den Leader, Mr. Nate Piatt, has completed his Master's Degree and the Commencement ceremony is on May 7. We are proud of Nate's accomplishment and want to honor his service by holding the Cub Scout event on an alternate evening to allow Nate to participate in both events.

BOY SCOUT TROOP

The Boy Scout Troop received four new members in March when the Arrow of Light scouts from the Cub Scout Pack "graduated" into the Troop. The Troop has a campout scheduled at Mittry Lake the weekend of May 9 and 10.
