## Pastor D's Letter October, 2022

OCTOBER 2022

Early in the evening on All Saints Day, October 31, 1517 Martin Luther hung "95 Theses" on the door of Castle Church in Wittenberg. His intent was to begin a dialogue that would lead to church reform. Luther wanted to elevate Scripture as the Word of God above the tradition of the church. Luther wanted to do away with selling indulgences as penance because it undermined "salvation by grace received in faith." Unfortunately, Luther's reforms fell on deaf ears. Many today think of this as the beginning of the "Reformation" however, the Reformation began much earlier and continued long after Luther's actions.

During October I invite you to bring friends for food and fellowship and to learn together about our faith. Each Sunday afternoon at 4 p.m. we will learn about the life on a different "Reformer" by watching a video presentation on their life (and in some cases, their martyrdom). In November, during Sunday school, our class will study an overview of the Reformation. The videos shown on Sundays vary in length from a half hour to a full-length movie. Join us each week for a unique opportunity for fellowship and learning. Below is a brief outline of the Reformers we will study and the fellowship opportunity.
