If you followed a timeline of the men who led the Reformation, the next reformer in our study would be Martin Luther. Luther is often thought to be the one who began the Reformation on October 31, 1517. In our study we will hold the Luther movie for October 30th. This week we study William Tyndale. Tyndale was a linguist who spoke seven languages and could also read and translate proficiently Hebrew and Greek. Tyndale's translation of the Bible into English was based on the Hebrew and Greek texts. According to one estimate the New Testament in the King James Version is 83% Tyndale's words and the Old Testament 76%.

While Tyndale's passion for the Bible led to the Bible being translated into English, it also led to his becoming a martyr on October 6, 1536.
